STABLING-\$35 per stall per night, stall door provided (bedding, hay and feed available for purchase). Layover stabling for horses wishing to remain overnight following the competition will be charged \$50 per stall per day.

COGGINS: All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have valid proof of a negative Coggins test (within 12 months of the competition date). [A copy of a Neg. Coggins dated March 31, 2011 or later **must** accompany the entry form or the entry is considered incomplete.](#)

HEALTH PAPERS: A 30 day certificate of veterinary inspection/health certificate is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Kentucky. Horses originating in Kentucky must have a valid certificate of veterinary inspection/health certificate dated within 12 months. (Information Source: KHP Horse Show Information <http://www.kyhorsepark.com/events-competition-info/horse-show-information/>) All health papers should travel with the horse.

PIRO: Horses entering the state of Kentucky from Texas must have valid proof of a negative Piro (Equine Piroplasmiasis/T. equi genitalis) test.

COMBINED TRAINING MEDICAL CARD: A completed USEA Medical Card, enclosed in a clear waterproof carrier, is required to be worn on the upper arm outside the competitor's clothing. Riders without the card will not be allowed in the Stadium Jumping Arena.

RIDER ATTIRE: Attire per MSEA & USEF Rules is required. In case of cold/rain, appropriate clothing may be [added](#).

STARTING TIMES: Will be posted on **March 24** at www.ckrh.org No times will be given over the phone

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE: Dressage-8.00 am, Stadium Course open for inspection-9.00 am, Stadium Jumping-10.00 am

ARENAS: Sand arenas in Dressage Complex (Small for Classes 1-10/Standard for Classes 11-16). Sport footing in the Claiborne Ring at the Hunter/Jumper Complex.

VETERINARIAN: Hagyard Equine Medical Institute. Additional information will be posted at the secretary's office and barns at the competition.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL AND FARRIER: On grounds the day of the competition.

BEDDING, HAY AND FEED: Available by calling Dever Show Services at 859.619.4080 or 859.233.9702. Competitors should contact Dever Show Services at least 24 hours prior to their arrival to make arrangements.

**MORE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

AND DRESSAGE COMPETITION**

Kentucky Horse Park TOP 10 RULES

1. **PARKING** - Passes may be obtained from the Parking Booth or Visitor Information Center upon entry. **\$5.00** fee assessed for each **parking pass** per event. **Horse trailer day passes** are required for all competitors showing out of their trailer and must be purchased for **\$20 per day or \$75 for a seasonal pass through show office**. All trailers must park in approved lot. **NO PARKING** is allowed in the barn area. **Trailers should be dropped in the main Kentucky Horse Park parking lot and NOT in the stabling area.**
2. **CAMPING**- Must go to campground for camping, unless event has made separate arrangements with KHP Special Events. **NO CAMPING ALLOWED IN THE BARNS AT ANY TIME!** KHP now accepts reservations. Please call 888/4KYPARK (888/459-7275) or reserve on-line at www.parks.ky.gov Groups of 20 or more, please call 859/259-4257 or 800/370-6416. Check-out time is at noon. Violators will be towed.
3. **GOLF CARTS/ MOPEDS ETC.** - A privilege-*not a right*- extended to show participants. Must be at least 16 years of age with valid driver's license. **Not allowed in the Tourist/Visitor areas of the Park. A Golf Cart License is required for all private golf-carts and can be obtained for \$25/event or \$50/season from the golf cart vendor office. NO ALL TERRAIN (4-wheeler, 3-wheeler, dirt bikes over 50 cc's) VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED ON HORSE SHOW GROUNDS!**
4. **DOGS**- Must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose animals or animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.
5. **HORSES AND HORSE DRAWN VEHICLES/STABLING** – Have the right-of-way at all times. Competitors must comply with contracted ship-in and ship-out dates. All competitors must ship-out by 8.00 am the day after the competition unless layover stabling permission has been granted.
6. **EXHIBITOR PROBLEMS/SPECIAL REQUESTS**-All non-emergency problems or special requests *must* be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.
7. **PACKAGES/DELIVERIES**- The Park is **not** responsible for any deliveries to an event or event participant. Receiving party must be present when delivery is expected. Park mail service personnel will try to assist if conditions allow, however, any delivery/package may be refused/returned to sender, etc. at any time without notification. The park charges shipping and handling charges for any package received on park grounds.
8. **PARK ADMISSION**- Reduced Park admission is available to event participants and must be obtained at the Visitor Information Center. Proof of event participation may be required at time/point of sale.
9. **FIRE CODES** – As of May 15, 2006, The Kentucky Horse Park will not allow the following inside of barns or tents, which will be enforced by the Fire Marshall:
 - a. any 2-wire appliances
 - b. any 2-wire extension cords
 - c. light duty cords for indoor use
 - d. any 3-way adaptors unless specifically made for outdoors
 - e. any adaptors without 3-wire connections
 - f. any cut or damaged cords
10. **EVENT MANAGEMENT** is responsible for notifying/ making available all Park rules/regulations to participants in their event. Included but not limited to Exhibitors, Officials and Volunteers.

The Jockey Club Launches Incentive Program for Thoroughbred Sport Horses

The Jockey Club today announced the launch of the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P), which will recognize and reward the versatility of the Thoroughbred through sponsorship classes of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at locally, nationally or internationally sanctioned horse shows. The Jockey Club has committed \$100,000 to the Thoroughbred Incentive Program for a pilot program in 2012.

"The Thoroughbred Incentive Program is a natural extension of our ongoing efforts in Thoroughbred aftercare," said James L. Gagliano, The Jockey Club's president and chief operating officer. "We encourage other groups to join us as we assist with the transition of Thoroughbreds into second careers."

"Thoroughbreds are versatile athletes, which makes them ideally suited for any number of disciplines beyond the racetrack," said Dell Hancock, a steward of The Jockey Club, a longtime Thoroughbred owner/breeder and a former horse show competitor. "The Thoroughbred Incentive Program will help showcase and reward the breed's many talents at all levels of competition and will encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds once they have finished their racing or breeding career."

"Although a Thoroughbred named Kim's Song never beat a horse on the race track, she went on to be a national hunter champion and put me on the map as a young rider in the 1970s, so I have a deep-rooted appreciation for Thoroughbreds competing in the show world," said R. Bruce Duchossois, a horse owner and breeder and championship competitor in multiple equestrian disciplines. "I commend The Jockey Club for developing an incentive program for Thoroughbred sport horses and I strongly encourage show organizers to participate by offering T.I.P.-sponsored Thoroughbred classes and awards in 2012."

Horse show organizers that would like to offer a T.I.P. Thoroughbred class and/or high point award at their show in 2012 should complete the T.I.P. application available at tjctip.com. T.I.P. sponsorships are available for a variety of disciplines, including eventing, dressage, hunters, jumpers and western and English pleasure, and will include ribbons, prizes and in some cases, purse money. The deadline for applications is November 30, 2011.

In addition to class and award sponsorships at shows, the Thoroughbred Incentive Program will also offer two annual awards in 2012:

The T.I.P. Thoroughbred of the Year Award will recognize a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work. The award will include a \$5,000 grant to the non-profit organization associated with the horse or, if not associated with a non-profit organization, to a horse-related charity chosen by The Jockey Club.

The T.I.P. Young Rider of the Year Award will recognize a young rider, 18 or under, who owns or leases a Thoroughbred for use in 4-H, Pony Club or other activities. The winner(s) will be determined through an essay contest with a total award of \$5,000 annually that can be applied to the college of their choice or to their participation in an event that furthers their involvement with horses. Applications for the T.I.P. Thoroughbred of the Year Award and T.I.P. Young Rider of the Year Award will be made available at tjctip.com in 2012.

Thoroughbreds registered with The Jockey Club will be eligible for participation in all T.I.P. classes and awards. Horse owners interested in participating in T.I.P. can find more information regarding eligibility and assistance with identification of Thoroughbreds at tjctip.com.

I wish to advance purchase the following seasonal pass/passes from the Kentucky Horse Park for the duration of the 2012 season. Seasonal passes can also be purchased upon arrival to the park.

- Seasonal Vehicle Parking Pass** *(See pricing on next page)*
 - Allows vehicle entry into the Kentucky Horse Park main parking lot for the duration of the 2012 season. (Seasonal Parking Pass will not allow entry during some special events such as Rolex, Southern Lights, etc.)
 - Regular parking fees of \$3/day or \$5/event are waived.
 - The seasonal parking pass is a hang tag that must be displayed on rear view mirror. The parking pass is transferable between vehicles.
 - Does not include park admission.

- Seasonal Trailer Grounds Fee Pass (\$75)**
 - Required for all competitors attending an equine competition who show out of their trailer and do not rent a stall.
 - Day passes are also available for \$20/day and may be purchased through the event office during the competition. Day passes are not available for purchase in advance of event.
 - The seasonal pass is a sticker that must be displayed in the license plate area of the trailer or rear lower left corner of the trailer. Seasonal trailer grounds pass (sticker) is not transferable between trailers.

- Seasonal Golf Cart License (\$50)**
 - Required for all individuals who bring a privately owned golf cart or similar vehicle (John Deere Gators, Mules, or other rural rated vehicles) onto the park.
 - Event licenses are also available for \$25/event and may be purchased through Dever's Show Services in the stabling area or the Kentucky Horse Park Campground Store. Event licenses are valid for seven days of occupancy. Event licenses are not available for purchase in advance of event.
 - Seasonal license is a sticker that must be displayed on the driver's side front panel or windshield of the vehicle. Sticker is not transferable between vehicles.
 - The Kentucky Horse Park does not allow four wheelers, three wheelers, or dirt bikes over 50cc on park grounds.
